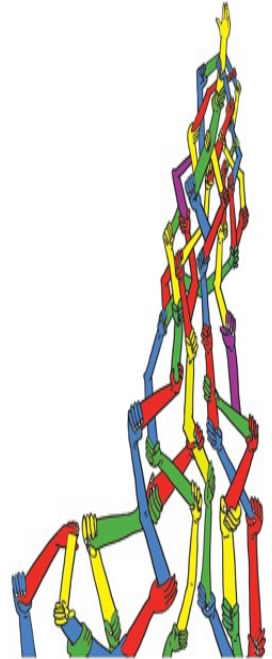


Siddhartha Mitra
